## **ESSAY CONTEST RULES & REGULATIONS**

- 1. This year's Essay Contest topic/title is: "What more should America do to protect her borders?"
- Any student enrolled in grades 9 through 12 in a public, private or parochial school or who is home schooled in Pennsylvania is eligible to participate.
- 3. All essays MUST have a cover page containing the following information:
  - Essay topic/title
  - Name, address, telephone, & email address (if applicable) of contestant.
  - Sponsoring American Legion Post number, name & location.
  - Parent or guardian name.
- 4. The topic/title MUST appear on page one (1) of the essay, as well as the cover page.
- 5. ALL essays MUST be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words.
- 6. Typewritten essays are preferred but not required.
- 7. Essays shall be judged on the following:
  - Proper English structure.
  - > Accuracy.
  - Extent of information
  - Originality Any material not original must be cited in a bibliography for the information of the judges, stating publication, volume, page, date, publisher and author.

- 8. Students MUST certify that essays are prepared without assistance other than that provided for all members of their class.
- 9. The PA Essay Program, as any program conducted by The American Legion, is designed to provide balanced judging. It is suggested that at least three (3) qualified judges be used at each level.
- 10. To locate a post near you go to <u>www.legion.org</u> & click on <u>find a post</u> and enter your zip code.
- The "local school" shall determine its own winner and <u>submit the</u> <u>winning essay to the sponsoring or</u> <u>local American Legion Post</u> no later than January 15, 2016
- 12. The "local American Legion Post" winning essay shall be selected and forwarded to the local District American Legion Essay Chairperson (as listed in the current American Legion Directory) no later than January 29, 2016
- The "District" winning essay shall be forwarded to the appropriate Inter-District Essay Coordinator (as listed in the current American Legion Directory) no later than February 12, 2016.

- 14. The "Inter-District" winning essay shall be forwarded to the Department of PA Essay Contest Sectional Vice Chairperson (as listed in the current American Legion Directory) no later than March 11, 2016.
- 15. The "Sectional" winning essay shall be selected and forwarded to the Pennsylvania Department Essay Chairperson, Tom Shumaker, no later than April 4, 2016.

The Department Essay Chairperson shall arrange for qualified judges who will select the 2015 Department of Pennsylvania Essay program finalist no later than **April 15, 2016.** 

### PRIZES TO BE AWARDED

- 1. The Department of Pennsylvania State Essay **First Place Winner** will be awarded a \$3,500 scholarship, a plaque and a trip to the PA American Legion Convention in July to read the winning essay to the assembled delegates.
- 2. The **Second Place Winner** will receive a \$3,000 scholarship and a plaque.
- 3. The **Third Place Winner** will receive a \$2,500 scholarship and a plaque.
