ESSAY CONTEST

"WHAT DOES THE AMERICAN FLAG REPRESENT."

- 1. This year's Essay Contest topic/title is: "What does the American Flag Represent."
- 2. Any student enrolled in grades 6 through 8 in a public, private or parochial school or who is home schooled in Pennsylvania is eligible to participate.
- 3. All essays **MUST** have a cover page containing the following information:
 - Essay topic/title
 - > Name, address, telephone, & email address (if applicable) of contestant.
 - > Sponsoring American Legion Post number, name & location.
 - Parent or guardian name.
- 4. The topic/title **MUST** appear on page one (1) of the essay, as well as the cover page.
- 5. ALL essays **MUST** be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words.
- 6. Typewritten essays are preferred but not required.
- 7. Essays shall be judged on the following:
 - Proper English structure.
 - > Accuracy.
 - Extent of information
 - Originality Any material not original must be cited in a bibliography for the information of the judges, stating publication, volume, page, date, publisher and author.
- 8. Students **MUST** certify that essays are prepared without assistance other than that provided for all members of their class. Certification not provided will result in disqualification.
- 9. The PA essay program, as any program conducted by The American Legion, is designed to provide balanced judging. It is suggested that at least three (3) qualified judges be used.
- 10. The "**local school**" must determine its own winner(s) and submit the winning essay(s) to the sponsoring or American Legion Post(s) immediately for judging.
- 11. The local post shall determine when the contest will be held and types of awards to be presented.
- 12. Question on this Essay Contest can be directed to the Chairman.
